Ways to Support & \$upport
Saint Luke's Church

First, pray for the ministry daily, read holy writ, and consistently attend the masses, remembering that God feeds those who come to worship and adore Him in His most Holy House of prayer and worship. **Second**, here are four ways to financially support God's work in our Parish:

Operating Fund - The primary vehicle through which to exercise financial commitment is the pledge/tithe to the Operating Fund, which supports the mission and ministry of our parish. A pledge drive is initiated for the Operating Fund in the Fall of each year, and the appropriate time to make your pledge is when joining St Luke's.

Special Memorials - Flowers, etcetera are another way in which to not only glorify God but also support your parish Church. Many of the accoutrements (crosses, works of art, et al) that are a part of our lovely church were made possible by extraordinary gifts of friends and members of the parish. If you are interested in memorializing a Loved One, talk with the Bishop for specifics.

Estate Planning - Remember your parish church in your estate planning. Charitable Remainder Trusts, Wills, etcetera, are all good vehicles through which your support may be given. Consult your lawyer and accountant for specifics and guidance - where there's a Will, there's a way!

As worship, even with the 1928 Book of Common Prayer, is a bit different in each parish church, it is our hope that the insert will help your understanding of our liturgical worship of Almighty God this day, and therefore help you to truly worship and adore our Lord Jesus Christ. We are an Anglo Catholic parish, part of the continuing Church movement in the United States, and a member of the Anglican Diocese of Arizona.

OUR BELIEFS are based on the teaching of the Bible and the ancient creeds of the Church. We use the 1928 Book of Common Prayer as the basis for our worship.

OUR MISSION is to worship God, serve Jesus Christ, and to bring mankind to Jesus and His Church by: (1) proclaiming biblical truth through Catholic order as it is embodied in the historic Book of Common Prayer; (2) preaching God's Word and administering His Holy Sacraments; (3) showing the love of Christ by reaching out to others through works of charity; and (4) upholding Christian family values and teaching the Christian faith and New Testament morality to our children.

OUR GOALS are: (1) to grow in understanding of and participation in the corporate worship services of the Church; (2) to read Holy Scripture daily; and (3) to love God and our Neighbor more fully.

NOTE: At today's Mass, the "Last Gospel" is added to the liturgy (Stand during the recitation). Upon its conclusion, the closing hymn is then sung.

Today's Mass Propers

INTROIT. *Circumdederunt. Psalm 18*

THE sorrows of death compassed me, the pains of hell gat hold upon me: and in my tribulation I made my prayer unto the Lord, and he regarded my supplication out of his holy temple. I will love thee, O Lord my strength: the Lord is my stony rock, my fortress, and my Saviour. V. Glory be.

O LORD, we beseech thee favourably to hear the prayers of thy people: that we, who are justly punished for our offences, may be mercifully delivered by thy goodness, for the glory of thy Name. [Through.]

EPISTLE. *1 Corinthians 9:24-27*

24 Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.

25 And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible.

26 I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air:

27 But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway.

GRADUAL. Ps 9. The Lord will be a refuge in the time of trouble: and they that know thy Name will put their trust in thee: for thou, Lord, hast never failed them that seek thee. V. For the poor shall not always be forgotten: the patient abiding of the meek shall not perish for ever: up Lord, and let not man have the upper hand.

TRACT. Ps 130. Out of the deep have I called unto thee, O Lord: Lord hear my voice. V. O let thine ears consider well: the voice of my complaint. V. If thou, Lord, wilt be extreme to mark what is done amiss: O Lord, who may abide it? V. For there is mercy with thee: therefore shalt thou be feared.

GOSPEL. *Saint Matthew 20:1-15*

1 THE kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which went out early in the morning to hire labourers into his vineyard.

2 And when he had agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard.

3 And he went out about the third hour, and saw others standing idle in the marketplace,

4 And said unto them; Go ye also into the vineyard, and whatsoever is right I will give you. And they went their way.

5 Again he went out about the sixth and ninth hour, and did likewise.

6 And about the eleventh hour he went out, and found others standing idle, and saith unto them, Why stand ye here all the day idle?

7 They say unto him, Because no man hath hired us. He saith unto them, Go ye also into the vineyard; and whatsoever is right, that shall ye receive.

8 So when even was come, the lord of the vineyard saith unto his steward, Call the labourers, and give them their hire, beginning from the last unto the first.

9 And when they came that were hired about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny.

10 But when the first came, they supposed that they should have received more; and they likewise received every man a penny.

11 And when they had received it, they murmured against the goodman of the house,

12 Saying, These last have wrought but one hour, and thou hast made them equal unto us, which have borne the burden and heat of the day.

13 But he answered one of them, and said, Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst not thou agree with me for a penny?

14 Take that thine is, and go thy way: I will give unto this last, even as unto thee.

15 Is it not lawful for me to do what I will with mine own? Is thine eye evil, because I am good?

16 So the last shall be first, and the first last: for many be called, but few chosen.

OFFERTORY. Psalm 92:1. It is a good thing to give thanks unto the Lord, and to sing praises unto thy Name, O Most Highest.

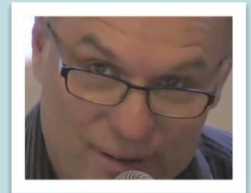
